Restructure of PEC Committee

The restructure of the PEC Committee to ensure focus is equally directed to both workplace culture and consumer engagement strategies is continuing, with changes expected to be announced in the coming month. Dashboard monitoring of workplace culture and consumer engagement activity and outcomes will also be introduced as part of these changes.

Job Role Culture and Engagement Presentations

Information about culture and engagement within Dental Health Services was the focus of the monthly presentation to PEC. Sam Carrello provided an overview of how staff were consulted (such as focus groups, surveys and reference groups) and the strategies implemented to improve workplace culture, such as recording meetings and introducing a staff mentoring program. Sam reiterated the importance of leadership at all levels and shared the shift in culture that has taken place, with staff thinking less about 'what we can't do' and more about 'what can be done with what we have'. The Board commended Sam and Dental Health Services staff for what they have achieved in regards to staff culture and engagement. They will continue to monitor this using the results of the Your Voice in Health Survey.
