

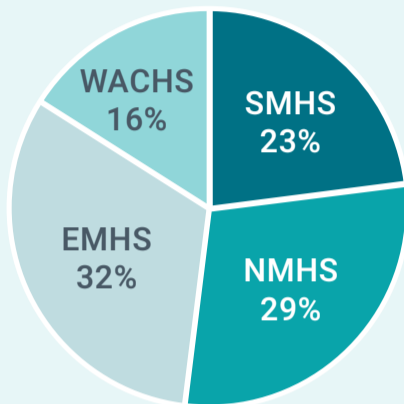

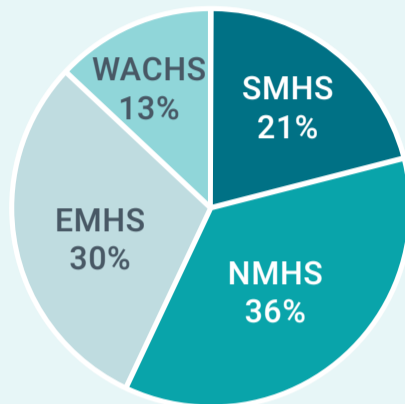

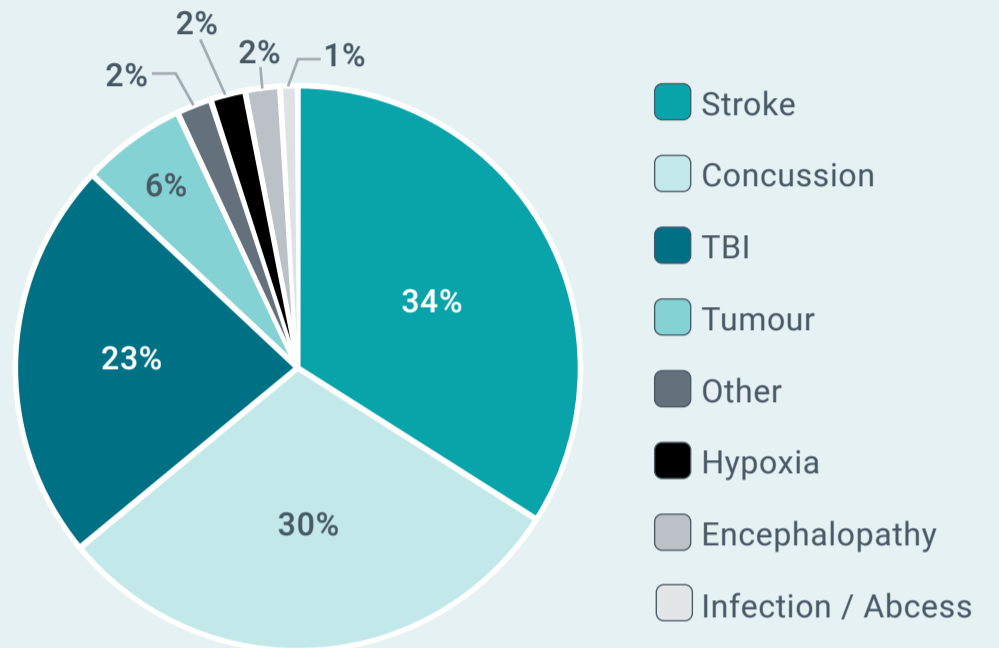

Innovation

- Development of a study group to assist students with returning to formal study post-ABI
- Development of a six-week carers group education and support program



Teamwork

- Presenters at the May 2023 ASSBI conference in areas of:
 - » Aboriginal health and ABI
 - » Consumer engagement and concussion
 - » SHIU Model of Care
 - » SHIU outcome measures
- Winners of the Public Health 100km April Walking Challenge



Coordinated care

- 92% of clients triaged within 10 business days of receiving referral
- Average time from triage to allocation for clients following concussion is 12 days



Partnering with stakeholders

- Host to four occupational therapy honours students exploring return to work outcomes post-ABI
- Active member of the WA ABI Advisory Group
- Contributor to the development of the Clinical Practice Guidelines for concussion through University of Qld
- Presented to 12 WA Health services on SHIU services and ABI rehabilitation

Consumer education

- 155 participants (clients and/or family/carer) attended an Understanding ABI seminar
- 57 support workers attended ABI training either via SHIU or at their organisation



Communicating for safety

- 93% of clients were provided a summary of their goals and outcomes within one week of discharge
- 95% compliance for mandatory training

Client satisfaction

- 100% of clients surveyed would recommend the service to others in a similar situation.
